

**Контроль навыков аудирования**

**Цель:**

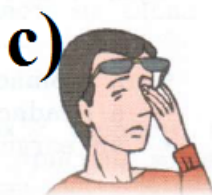
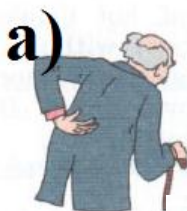

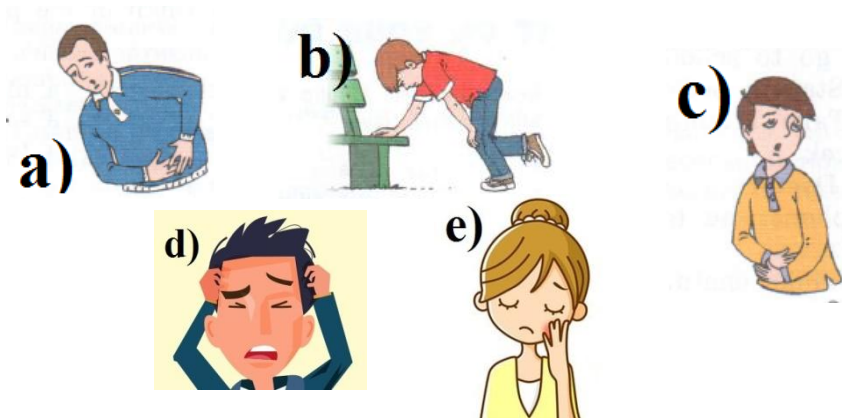

### Задание I

### Задание II

#### A Sweet Tooth

Cakes, chocolate, ice cream... the British love them all. A meal is not a full meal without some kind of dessert and sweet things are very popular as a snack too. Every shopping street has a baker's shop selling bread and cakes, and newsagent's shops usually sell chocolate and ice cream as well as newspapers.

Chocolate is the most popular sweet snack, and the British eat more than eight kilograms per person per year of it. Christopher Columbus, the Italian traveller who was born in 1451 and died in 1506, brought chocolate from Central America to Europe at the end of the 15th century. But people really began to eat it in Britain not earlier than the mid-nineteenth century. The Cadbury family began to make drinking chocolate in Birmingham in 1831. By 1878 they had 200 workers. They needed a bigger factory, so they bought some land and built a new one. They also built a whole village for the workers, which they called Bourneville. By 1881 they were selling chocolate as far away as Australia, and by 1899 they had more than 2,600 workers.

People eat chocolate almost anywhere, anytime, but it becomes very popular at Christmas and Easter. Dark chocolate, milk chocolate, white chocolate... there are many kinds to choose from. You can buy British chocolate products all over the world.

### Задание III

#### **Задание IV**

Dr. Gordon: Come in and sit down, Paul. What's the matter with you? You don't look your best today.

Paul: I've got a bad headache, doctor. I've been feeling bad since yesterday night.

Dr. Gordon: Have you taken your temperature?

Paul: No, I haven't. I never have a temperature.

Dr. Gordon: Never say never, my boy. Let's take it now. Here is a thermometer. Please tell me more. Are you sneezing or coughing? Is your nose running? Is there any pain in your heart or lungs?

Paul: No, doctor, I don't think so. I just have this headache and it hurts me to swallow, just a little.

Dr. Gordon: Will you open your mouth wide? I'd like to see your throat. I think you're coming down with a cold, Paul. Now, let's look at your temperature. Tut-tut. What did I tell you? Never say never. Your temperature is 37.8. I'll prescribe some medicine to bring it down. Ask one of your parents to get it for you.

Paul: Is it all, doctor?

Dr. Gordon: Stay in bed, drink a lot of warm tea or milk, take the medicine I've prescribed and something for your headache. I'll call tomorrow afternoon and examine you again.

Paul: Thank you for your time, Doctor.

Dr. Gordon: Get well, Paul. I'll see you tomorrow.
